Are there licence arrangements in place, to ensure the appropriate entities have authority to use the IP?



Does the website have terms of use, terms of trade and a privacy policy?

Is there software, mobile applications, or website content/code being developed? Are there written agreements to clarify ownership?



Are there agreements with third parties - manufacturers, distributors, retailers, suppliers, contractors and



Is the business advertising? Are there appropriate controls around use of the business' IP?



Are employees creating or improving IP? Is this adequately covered in employment agreements?



Are pro forma confidentiality agreements used which inadequately address IP or fail to cover vital business nuances?



Is there a budget for enforcement of IP rights in the case of an infringement?
